## CORRIGENDUM

- 1) It is brought to the notice of all the aspirant and registered candidates of CSAB-NEUT 2018 in the NEUT Information Brochure 2018 page number 16 point no. 6.1.2 paragraph "[For 6.1.1 and 6.1.2, the marks scored in the following five subjects will be considered for calculating the aggregate marks and the qualifying marks for fulfilling the top 20 percentile criterion: (i)Physics, (ii)Chemistry, (iii)Mathematics, (iv) a language (if the candidate has taken more than one language, then the language with the higher marks will be considered), and (v) any subject other than the above four (the subject with the higher marks will be considered), as per JoSAA-2018 business rules]" shall be read as "[For 6.1.1 and 6.1.2, the marks scored in the following five subjects will be considered for calculating the aggregate marks and the qualifying marks for fulfilling the top 20 percentile criterion: (i)Physics, (ii)Chemistry, (iii)Mathematics, (iv) a language (if the candidate has taken more than one language, then the language with the higher marks will be considered), and (v) any subject other than the above four (the subject with the higher marks will be considered) or as per Annexure 2(b) of JoSAA-2018 business rules]" available on [www.josaa.nic.in](http://www.josaa.nic.in).
- 2) For Tripura Candidates  
After allotting 47 seats of overall 50 seats , the remaining 03 seats shall be made available to the candidates of PwD category.

The other provisions for eligibility criteria and top 20 percentile mentioned in the NEUT Information Brochure 2018 remain same.

**Performance in Class XII (or equivalent) examination  
(Applicable only for candidates seeking admission to NITs/IITs and other  
GFTIs)**

1. One of the criteria for admission to NITs/IITs/Other participating GFTIs is that the candidate should satisfy at least one of these two criteria:
  - (i) The candidate is within the category-wise top 20 percentile of successful candidates in their respective Class XII (or equivalent) examination of respective stream and Board.
  - (ii) The candidate has secured minimum 75% (for GEN or OBC-NCL) or minimum 65 % (for SC, ST or PwD) of aggregate marks in the Class XII (or equivalent) examination of respective stream and Board.
  
2. The marks scored in the following five subjects will be considered for calculating the aggregate marks and the cut-off marks for fulfilling the top 20 percentile criterion.
  - (a) For B.E./B.Tech. programmes
    - i. Physics
    - ii. Mathematics
    - iii. Any one of Chemistry, biology, biotechnology, technical vocation subject.
    - iv. A language (if the candidate has taken more than one language, then the language with the higher marks will be considered)
    - v. Any subject other than the above four (the subject with the highest marks will be considered).
  - (b) For B.Arch./B.Planning, the marks in the following subjects will be considered:
    - (i) Mathematics
    - (ii) Other four subjects

3. If a Board awards only letter grades without providing an equivalent percentage of marks on the grade sheet, the candidate should obtain a certificate from the Board specifying the equivalent marks and submit it at the time of acceptance of the allocated seat. In case such a certificate is not provided, the decision taken by CSAB 2018 will be final.
4. If a Board gives aggregate marks considering both Class XI and Class XII examinations (in the 10+2 system), then only the Class XII marks will be considered. Similarly, for Boards which follow a semester system, the marks scored in the final two semesters will be considered.
5. For candidates who appeared in the Class XII (or equivalent) Board examination in 2017 but reappeared in 2018, the best of the two performances will be considered.
6. If a Board does not give marks scored in individual subjects but gives only the aggregate marks, then the aggregate marks given by the Board will be considered as such.
7. In case any of the subjects Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics and Language are not evaluated in the final year (e.g., in a 3-year diploma course), then the marks for the same subject from the previous year/s will be used for calculating percentage of aggregate marks.

**Regarding the qualifying marks for the top 20 percentile**

8. The qualifying marks for PwD category candidates will be the same as the lowest of the qualifying marks for GEN, OBC-NCL, SC and ST category candidates.

9. The top 20 percentile qualifying marks of the respective Boards in 2017 will be considered for candidates who appeared in Class XII (or equivalent) examination for the first time in 2017 and pass the examination in 2017.
10. The top 20 percentile qualifying marks of the respective Boards in 2018 will be considered for candidates who appeared in all required subjects for Class XII (or equivalent) examination in 2018 and pass the examination in 2018.
11. If a candidate appeared in Class XII (or equivalent) examination for the first time in 2017 and passed the examination, but reappeared in one or a few subjects in 2018 for improvement or any other reason, then top 20 percentile cut-off for 2017 will be considered for him. However, if a candidate writes all the subjects in 2018, the best of the two performances will be considered.
12. For those Boards whose result was declared after June 2016, the top 20 percentile qualifying marks of the respective Boards in 2016 will be considered for candidates who appeared in Class XII (or equivalent) examination for the first time in 2016 and pass the examination in 2016.
13. In case a Board does not provide information about the qualifying marks for the top 20 percentile, the candidate will have to produce a certificate from the respective Board stating that he/she/it falls within the top 20 percentile of successful candidates. If the candidate fails to do so, then the qualifying marks for the CBSE will be used.
